Information from the Principal's Office

- **Cap Collection:** The company that we partner with for collecting bottle caps has changes some of the acceptable caps. Below is a listing of what is acceptable and what is not.
The following is what is not acceptable
 - Metal, bags, trigger sprayers, fast food drink lids, plastic pieces and parts, pumps, recyclable numbers 1,3,6,7, bottles—**prescription bottles were acceptable in the past, but no longer are**, lids/caps with paper on them or on the inside of the cap---if it is removed, it is fine, lids larger than 8 inchesThe following are acceptable
 - Recycle 2,4,5, milk jug caps, medicine bottle caps, hair spray caps, toothpaste caps, deodorant caps, apple sauce pouch caps, drink bottle caps, flip top caps (mustard/ketchup) spray paint caps, ointment tube caps, baby food caps, shampoo/conditioner caps, cottage cheese lids, mayonnaise jar lids, yogurt lids, peanut butter lids, ice cream lids, cool whip lids, coffee can lids, cream cheese lids, butter lids, Pringles lids

If you could also ask them to rinse off the caps before sending them and remove any paper on them (they

must be paper free), it would be greatly appreciated. Kids are touching and sorting these, and we don't want to be spreading unnecessary germs around.
